

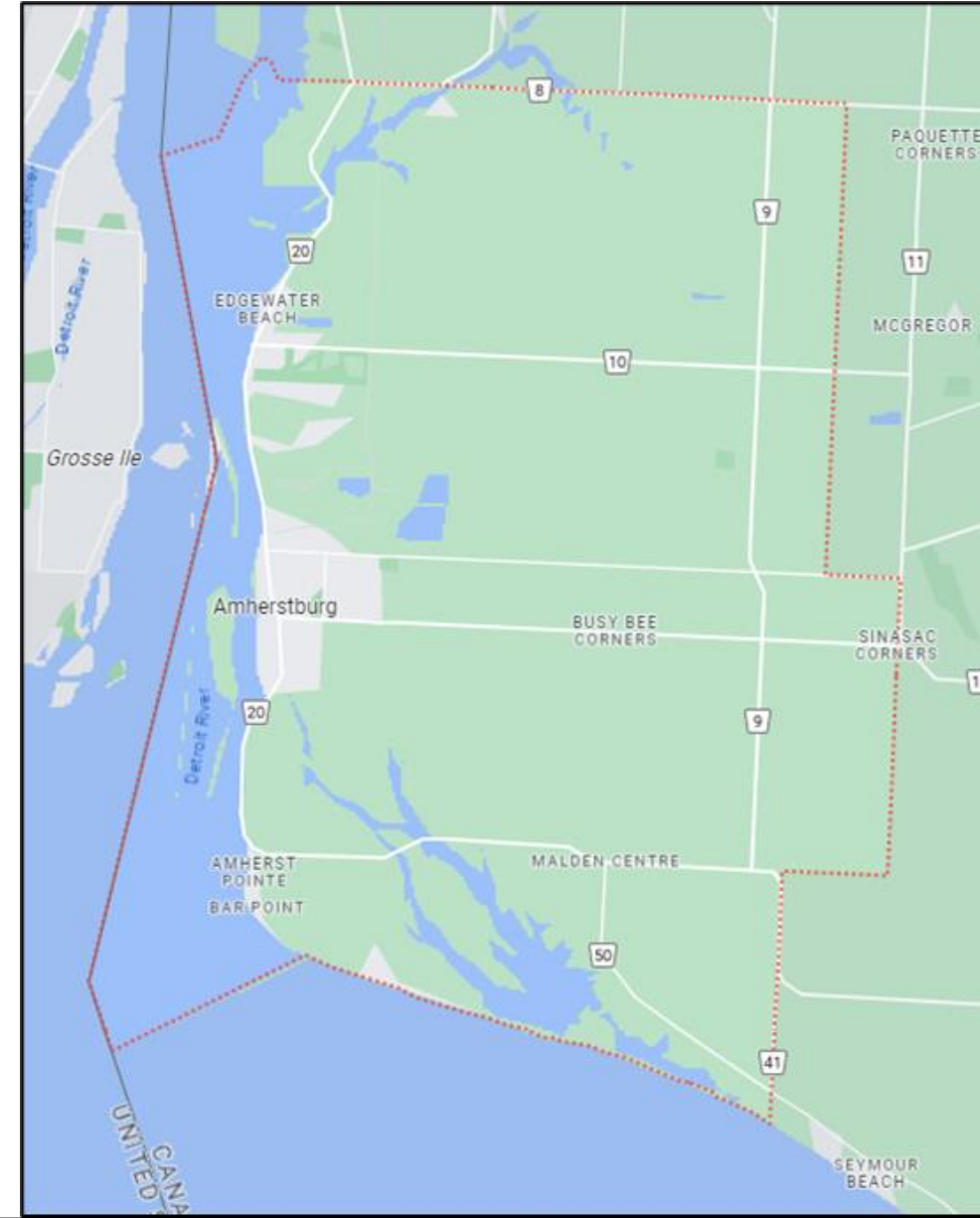

Boblo Island Natural Gas Expansion Project

Project details and background

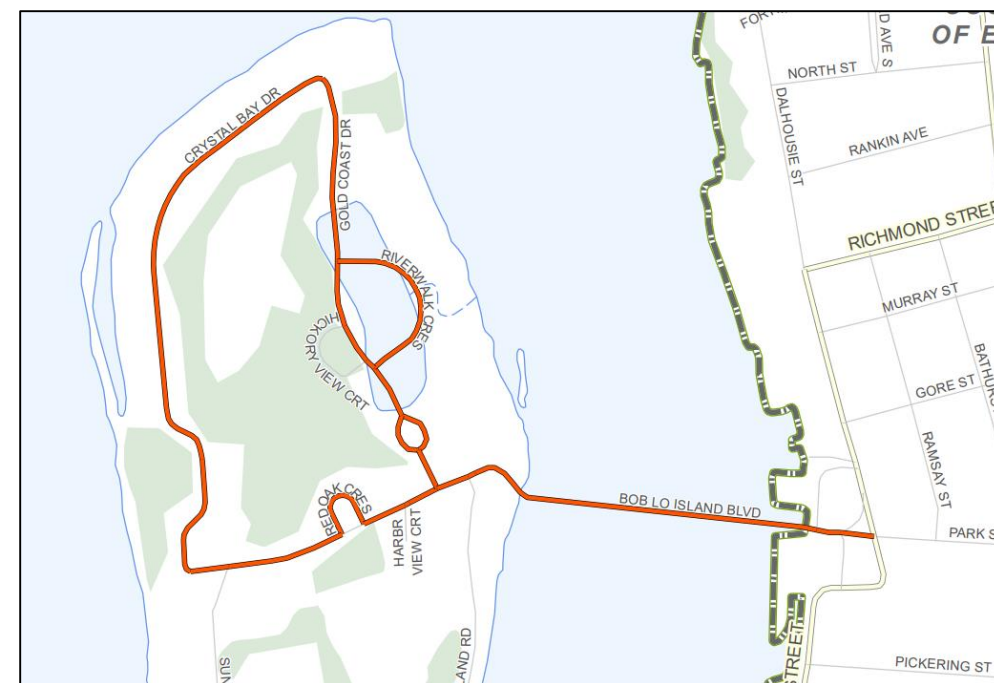
- This project is part of the Ontario Government's Natural Gas Expansion Program.
- This project is funded by approximately \$1.9 million from the Ontario Government, in addition to the expansion surcharge (23 cents/m³) to be paid over a term of 40 years by all customers (on Boblo Island) served by the project.
- The proposed project will include approximately 2.9 km of new natural gas pipeline consisting of a combination of 2" and 4" plastic and steel and will initially provide service to approximately 92 forecasted customers.
- The entire Project scope is a distribution pipeline, with an approximate 600-meter crossing of the Detroit River.
- The proposed tie-in point will be near the intersection of Dalhousie Street & Park Street, connecting to the existing 4" steel.
- The north part of the island is planned to be serviced, including Boblo Island Blvd., Gold Coast Dr., Riverwalk Cres., Red Oak Cres., and Crystal Bay Dr.



Boblo Island Natural Gas Expansion Project

Detroit River crossing

- The pipe crossing the River will be horizontally directional drilled at a depth confirmed in accordance with an engineering design.
- Enbridge will determine if temporary land use (TLU) in Amherstburg is required after the engineering design is complete.
- Enbridge will obtain all the necessary permits to cross the Detroit River.
- The drill work may be noisy but will be conducted in accordance with municipal by-laws. Noise mitigation will be in place.



Boblo Island Community Expansion Project

Project details continued

- Due to the project scope, Ontario Energy Board (OEB) approval of the project is required prior to construction start.
- A leave to construct application is expected to be submitted to the OEB by Enbridge Gas in Q4 2023.
- If the project is approved by the OEB, and obtains all other permits and approvals as applicable:
 - Construction could begin as early as Q3 2024 and be complete by the end of 2024.
- Increase in property taxes paid to Municipality.

Boblo Island Community Expansion Project

Community consultation

- Public information sessions were held in March 2023 to provide information to the community and receive feedback on the proposed pipeline routes.
 - In-person session held at the Libro Credit Union Centre on March 20, 2023.
 - Concurrent with the in-person session, a virtual session was held from February 21, 2023 to March 25, 2023.
- All properties, along the initial proposed routes were sent notices of the information sessions and invited to attend.
- Newspaper notices were also published in the Amherstburg River Town Times.
- Market research was recently completed to gather the interest and results came back that 80% of the resident respondents would convert to natural gas

Billing and charges

Where does your money go?

Here's a helpful explanation of a few key items on your natural gas bill

Charge Category	Description
Expansion Surcharge	The fairest way to cover the infrastructure costs of expanding natural gas service.
Customer Charge	This is a fixed \$23.98* amount that pays for 24/7 emergency response and other services.
Supply, Delivery and Transportation Charges	These cover the costs to buy and deliver natural gas to your home.
Cost Adjustment	Natural gas rates vary by season—you pay what we pay.

* Subject to change. Please note that all charges, except the fixed customer charge, vary based on how much natural gas you use.

Frequently asked questions

Q: Why do I have to pay an additional charge towards the construction costs of the project?
A: For us to extend natural gas to rural areas where the cost of building the infrastructure is more than the revenue it generates, the Ontario Energy Board approved an additional expansion surcharge. This is a variable rate charge, based on your usage, of \$0.23/cubic metre of natural gas used. Since homes use more natural gas in colder months, the surcharge will be higher in winter. It will appear as a separate line item on your monthly bill for up to 40 years.

Q: Why is the surcharge in effect for different lengths of time by community?
A: The length of time the surcharge remains in effect varies by community because the overall cost to serve each community is different, based on factors such as the distance of the community from an existing natural gas pipeline and more.
