Subject: Request to Name Section of Dalhousie Street as Veterans Way

1. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that:

1. The request from Royal Canadian Legion Fort Malden Branch 157 for the honorary naming of Dalhousie Street from Richmond Street to Gore Street as Veterans Way **BE APPROVED.**

2. BACKGROUND:

On November 20, 2024, Administration received correspondence from Royal Canadian Legion Fort Malden Branch 157 requesting to name a section of Dalhousie Street from Richmond Street to Gore Street as Veterans Way.

3. DISCUSSION:

Administration is recommending that an honorary street name be created to publicly recognize Royal Canadian Legion without causing an official address change to the residents or businesses located on Dalhousie Street. Three (3) signs would be installed from Richmond Street to Gore Street. The signs will be different from the current decorative and common street name signs to prevent confusion to the public. All costs associated with the manufacturing and installation of the street name sign will be covered under the Sign and Devices budget in the Public Works Operational Budget. The signs would be maintained for as long as the Royal Canadian Legion remains on Dalhousie Street.

4. RISK ANALYSIS:

There is no risk associated with approval of this honorary street name sign. The honorary sign does not change the official street name and does not require residents and businesses to change their address.

5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

The estimated cost of this initiative is estimated at \$750 to manufacture the sign and complete works to the existing signage. The cost also includes maintaining the existing decorative signs that are impacted by this initiative.

6. ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPACTS:

The new honorary street name signs should be included in the asset management plan for tracking for maintenance and future replacements. In addition, the maintenance of the existing decorative signs should be updated to track the work completed.
