The goal of the Amherstburg Fire Department is to provide fire protection services through a range of programs designed to protect the lives and property of the inhabitants from the adverse effects of fire, sudden medical emergencies or exposure to dangerous conditions created by man or nature.

To achieve this goal, the Amherstburg Fire Department utilizes fire suppression and rescue activities, fire inspections, fire investigation, public fire safety education and other

fire protection programs as defined by the Fire Protection and Prevention Act, R.S.O.1997. and the Town of Amherstburg, Establishing and Regulating By-Law # 2023-076. The attached, represents activities and program delivery in addition to the attached Dashboard for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2024.

### In the Community:

During the last quarter Amherstburg Fire Department engaged with our community at several public events to promote fire education and safety. Our department was also able to conduct familiarization of response areas, and buildings.
