

LOT 8 HISTORY

IN 1799 LOT 8 WAS RESERVED FOR THE OCCUPATION OF JOHN SPARKMAN, THE BARRACK MASTER OF THE GARRISON.

THERE ARE MANY CONFLICTING RECORDS OF WHAT WAS HOUSED ON LOT 8. ORAL HISTORY MAINTAINS THAT THERE WAS FROM AN EARLY DATE A FRAME STRUCTURE WHICH HOUSED FIREFIGHTING EQUIPMENT.

IN 1907 A ONE-STORY CEMENT BLOCK STRUCTURE WAS BUILT ON THE LOT TO STORE COAL. THAT CEMENT BLOCK STRUCTURE IS WHAT IS NOW KNOWN AS 256 Dalhousie. Unfortunately, today no photographs exist in The Marsh Collection to show what the structure looked like over the years.

The Hard Truth

The current structure at 256 Dalhousie does not have remnants of its history nor does it reflect the heritage build form of the town.

CONSTRUCTION OF OUR HOTEL CONCEPT NECESSITATES THE DEMOLITION OF THE PRESENT STRUCTURE. HOWEVER, WE BELIEVE THAT OUR DESIGN IS IN KEEPING WITH THE SCALE AND DESIGN OF THE DOWNTOWN'S HERITAGE PROPERTIES.

WE KNOW THAT AMHERSTBURG IS A HERITAGE TOWN, AND WE ARE COMMITTED TO WORKING WITH YOU TO PRESERVE ITS HISTORY.

Specifically, we will fund and install a plaque to recognize that in 1799 the Lot was reserved for the occupation of John Sparkman, the Barrack Master of Fort Malden.

THE PLAN

WE HAVE HIRED ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN ASSOCIATES (ADA) WHO ARE KNOWN FOR SHAPING SPACE. THEY BELIEVE ARCHITECTURE SHOULD CHARM AND INSPIRE COMMUNITIES TO CONSIDER THE POSSIBILITIES FOR POSITIVE DEVELOPMENT IN OUR CITIES AND TOWNS.


