Voting Barriers I encountered during the 2022 Amherstburg Municipal Election.

Attitudinal barriers.

Ableism.

A lack of signage at the Libro Centre.

A lack of appropriate signage at the Libro.

A lack of resting seating at the Libro.

Voter notification cards arrived late.

Election worker misinformed voters about ID.

A lack of a variety of alternate voting methods; in person voting option during a pandemic.

I felt excluded from meaningful public consultation regarding voting methods due, in part, to:

- An error in the December 6, 2021 report to council that the appropriate by-law needed to be passed by May 1 in the year before the election instead of May 1 in the year of the election.
- Being advised, 'however, the error has no effect in that, so long as the by-law is passed before May 1, 2022.'
- By-laws passing first, second and third reading in one meeting.
- The rationale for a voting method based on what electors are familiar and comfortable with.
- A spontaneous in person question following voting.

Segregating voters with disabilities to use adaptive equipment at only one poll.

Lack of social media policy.

The use of town images and/or names may have been confusing to people with a variety of disabilities.
